Sept 8 Theodore Roosevelt: Roughrider to Rushmore —

Examines the life of the president who pushed for the construction of the Panama Canal, broke the trusts of the railroad barons, and revolutionized America's conservation movement.

Sept 9 FDR: The War Years — Explores Franklin D. Roosevelt's leadership during WWII, including a chronicle of those turbulent years, his battles with isolationists, the attack on Pearl Harbor, and the Yalta Conference.

Sept 10 Gerald Ford: Healing the Presidency — Profiles the "accidental president" who took over after Nixon's resignation and examines how he restored faith in the White House.

Sept 11 Ronald Reagan — Profile of the actor-turned-politician and oldest man ever elected to the U.S. presidency.

Sept 12 Bill Clinton: Hope, Charisma, and Controversy — Exploration of the childhood experiences and political career of the former president.

Sept 23 John and Abigail Adams: Love and Liberty — Profiles two of the most pivotal figures of the American Revolution, detailing their commitment to each other, their participation in the founding of the new nation, and their legacy.

Sept 24 Thomas Jefferson: Philosopher of Freedom — Profiles the public and private life of the statesman, scientist, architect, and president.
